




User Interface



In the tab **"view"** you can choose between different user interfaces.

In the user interface **"simple"** there is the player window, the metadata and the time-line.


The interface **"simple with clips"** additionally offers a list of all clips.



In the interface **"six players"** six player windows and the time-line are displayed.

Adding Elements

Each user interface may be customized. Click on "elements" in the top left corner.



Each element can be placed via drag & drop. After adding all desired elements close the pop up window by clicking OK.

You can **save your customized user interface** by clicking on "view" → floppy disk symbol 

Player Window



By clicking on the video the option window is opened. You can adjust the volume, show subtitles, change the signal, add screenshots and change to full-screen mode. Click OK to close the pop up window.

Time-line

In this are you will find many helpful features.



With this button  you can **reduce and pop up the time-line**.

With this symbol  you can display the **live signal**.


Via this symbol  you can select a date in the **calendar** and play the recorded program. Press "pause" before selecting the date.

Via this symbol  you start the **storyboard**.




You can fast-forward a recording by clicking on the space to the right of the play button. Keep the left mouse button pressed or double-click to lock the fast-forward position.

MetaData



In the **metadata** you can see which broadcast was shown at what time. Click on the calendar symbol in the metadata box. Upon selecting a day a list of all broadcasts with their starting time is displayed.

By clicking on a broadcast in the metadata list more information is shown. With the buttons below you can start the broadcast in the player, set the broadcast as selection in the time-line or search for broadcasts with the same title.




In the **MetaData Editor** you can create personal bookmarks. Just enter a title and text and click on this symbol  to set the selected time in the time-line or the selected broadcast from the metadata list as bookmark. You will now find your new bookmark in the MetaData Editor.

It is possible to start a search within the metadata.

Simply enter the word you would like to find broadcasts on into the field next to "title". You can filter your search by clicking on the rack-wheel symbol (e.g. choose the period you would like to search in).


In this example we searched for broadcasts concerning "water". All signals whose broadcasts match the search term are listed in the metadata box. By clicking on a signal you can see more details (date and name of the broadcast).

Creating Clips



You can create a clip from the selected time period in the time-line. Set a starting point in the time-line by clicking on  and an end point by clicking on .

Then click on "add current selection"  in the ClipEditor. You can now edit the title and change the start and end time before creating the clip by clicking on the paper clip symbol.



You will find your new clip in the window "clips". They are sorted by TV station. By clicking on the clip more information is displayed and with the symbols below you can play the clip, set its time as selection, download or delete the clip.


Via the magnifying glass symbol you can search for titles within the the existing clips.

The program charts show how often a program has been broadcast since recording began. The wheel symbol can be used to set search criteria such as minimum and maximum length of the commercial / program. You can also set how many items you want to display. You can use this feature to check, for example, how often your commercial has been broadcast and thus also compare how often other companies run commercials.

Synchronizing the Windows



By clicking on the top bar of the respective window or on the wrench symbol, you open the options and can now assign one of the colored markers. In this example, the red mark is selected.

This results in all windows with the same color mark being synchronized with each other - i.e. they refer to the same station at the same time.

Analysis Tools


Graph



In the graph, the ranges of different signals can be compared with each other according to target group. The number of viewers and the time of the broadcast can be read on the sides.


By clicking on the station symbol you can select which stations you would like to compare. You select the target group by clicking on the person symbol.

Audience Flow



The audience flow shows how many people of the selected target group (here: adults aged 14 to 49) switched channels at the time selected in the timeline. The largest point (in this example the blue point for RTL) was the station with the most viewers at the time.

Audience Spread




The window "Audience Spread" shows how many viewers switched to the respective station at the selected time. The pie chart of the audience spread shows the share in viewers of the stations compared with each other. The stations you would like to compare can be set by clicking on the corresponding icon.

Audience Grouping



The audience grouping indicates who watches the majority of the respective stations at the corresponding time. In this example, the majority of viewers at sixx are women who are older than the mainly male Kabel1 viewers.

Program Charts



In the program charts, you can first select the channel and then use the settings icon to select the minimum and maximum length as well as the number of positions displayed.

User Account

You will find information on your user account and the possibility to log off by clicking on this symbol  in the top right corner.
